2018 population estimates

1,239,000 households fail on a single criterion

547,000 households fall short of being adequately housed for two or more reasons

For variant 3, the number of households with their own home that appear to fall short of being adequately housed for two or more reasons falls to 218,000 households. This equates to 9% of all households and 23% of households that fall short of being adequately housed.

In our view, the estimates show that our current approach to measuring housing need is too narrow and that we pay too little attention to the wide spectrum of unacceptable housing conditions many individuals and families currently experience. They also show that whilst it is the most extreme form of failing, homelessness is by no means the only human rights failing in terms of adequate housing.
